Minutes of a Regular Meeting of Council for The Corporation of the Township of North Frontenac, held May 8, 2020 through the use of Electronic Participation.

a) Rick Proctor, Resident – 2020 Gypsy Moth Spray Program.

Be It Resolved That Council receives for information the Delegation from Rick Proctor, Resident regarding the 2020 Gypsy Moth Spray Program and seeking assistance with locating and securing a staging and landing area for the helicopter service for 2020 and requesting in the future, the Township secure an appropriate supplier, blanket contract and authorizations for this service. The contract could be exercised by individuals or groups if the Township itself does not undertake a spraying of its properties;

And That Council instructs the Clerk to advise Mr. Proctor to contact the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) directly to discuss Gypsy Moths as the Township does not have the expertise or resources to deal with Gypsy Moths, or the

financial resources to secure a contract for a Gypsy Moth Program. Also, Council does not approve of a helicopter service using Township property for this purpose;
And That Council does not permit spraying of Gypsy Moths on private property or Township property within the Township.

Therefore Be It Resolved That Council receives for information a report from Councillor Fowler with respect to the keeping of prohibited animals on a temporary or permanent basis, including information from the City of Toronto's Municipal Code, Chapter 349 and the City of Ottawa By-law 2003-77, Section 83; and Councillor Fowler advised most municipalities include in their By-law a list of the prohibited animals and specify no one can possess them;

And That Council instructs the Clerk to make the following amendments to the proposed new By-law to regulate animals within the Township:

- Add reptiles, venomous and poisonous animals as suggested by Councillor Fowler at today's meeting;

And That Council will consider a By-law to repeal #51-05 and adopt a new By-law to regulate animals within the Township at a future Meeting;

And That Council approves in principle the Amended Fees and instructs the Clerk to include these amended fees in the next Public Meeting held for Fees and Charges in 2020, with an effective date of January 1, 2021;

B1. Ed and Laurette Dobrowolski, Residents re: Roadside Clean-up

Be It Resolved That Council receives for information an email dated April 9, 2020 from Edward Dobrowolski, Resident, stating the Township's vision statement indicates we have a prestige environment; however when Mr. Dobrowolski and his wife go for a walk, they are appalled at the trash along the shoulders and ditches; and Mr. Dobrowolski suggested that during the current circumstances the Township send out a mass email to residents asking for volunteers to help clean up the roads with people being assigned a short section of road close to their residence, while maintaining physical distancing;

And That Darwyn Sproule, Public Works Manager, provided Mr. Dobrowolski with information regarding the Township's Adopt-a-Road program for residents, businesses or groups if they are interested in roadside cleanup; and that Public Works picked up litter at Mr. Dobrowolski's that was recently collected; and that in the interest of promoting this program, the Township provides a notice to the cottage associations, businesses and others;

And That Council will set a date this fall for a clean-up event to be promoted by the Township with Council Members, staff and residents volunteering to assist with roadside clean-up to beautify the Township and protect the environment in addition to the Adopt-a-Road Program;

And That if this day is successful, Council will consider holding these type of events each spring and fall;

Be It Resolved That Council receives for information an email dated April 23, 2020 from Rural Frontenac Community Services, advising that youth are a vital part of every community. Supporting and celebrating our youth is important for making youth feel that their community cares about them;

And That traditionally the first week of May is Youth Week; however due to the Covid-19 pandemic, Youth Week has been extended to be the whole month of May, with many

organizations across Kingston Frontenac Lennox & Addington working to provide online programming and content for youth to participate in through Youth Month;

B3. Cheryl Robson, Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) re: Residential Construction
Moved by Councillor Hermer, Seconded by Councillor Perry #191-20

Whereas on March 17, 2020 the government of Ontario announced that it was declaring a state of emergency under s 7.0.1 (1) of the *Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act* so that the Province could use every power possible to protect the health and safety of all individuals and families during the COVID-19 pandemic;

And Whereas on Friday, April 3, 2020, the government of Ontario gave notice of changes to Ontario Regulation 82/20 being the Order for the temporary closure of places of non-essential business made under subsection 7.0.2 (4) of the *Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act*, which reduced the list of essential businesses permitted to continue operation during the provincial state of emergency;

And Whereas Section 30 of the new Schedule 2 of Ontario Regulation 82/20 has been generally interpreted to prohibit residential construction where a building permit had not been issued prior to April 4, 2020;

And Whereas residential construction represents a significant number of jobs in rural Ontario and forms an integral part of the rural Ontario economy through considerable direct, indirect and induced impacts;

And Whereas on Monday, April 27, 2020 the government of Ontario released *A Framework for Reopening our Province*, which outlines the criteria Ontario's Chief Medical Officer of Health and health experts will use to advise the government on the loosening of emergency measures, as well as guiding principles for the safe, gradual reopening of businesses, services and public spaces;

And Whereas Stage 1 of the *Framework* will consider the opening of workplaces that can immediately meet or modify operations to meet public health guidance and occupational health and safety requirements;

And Whereas residential construction in rural areas is characterized by single-family dwelling types situated on large lots, which are attended by a very limited number of tradespersons and contractors at any given time, and are being constructed for specific clientele with planned occupancy dates;

Now Therefore Be It Resolved That the Council of the Township of North Frontenac requests that the government of Ontario consider lifting the prohibition on residential construction where no building permit had been issued prior to April 4, 2020, in all instances where such construction can take place in accordance with the principles outlined in the government’s *Framework for Reopening our Province* at its earliest opportunity in order to alleviate the economic hardships being experienced by rural Ontario’s construction sector and the residents and families which it serves;

And That this Resolution be forwarded to the Office of the Honourable Doug Ford, Premier of Ontario and the Honourable Steve Clark, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing;

And Further That a copy of this Resolution be sent to the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO), the Eastern Ontario Warden's Caucus (EOWC), and to all rural Ontario municipalities, requesting their support.

B4. Ron Higgins, Mayor re: Seniors Housing Project – County of Frontenac Funding Moved by Deputy Mayor Martin, Seconded by Councillor Perry #192-20

Be It Resolved That Council receives for information an email dated April 16, 2020 from Mayor Higgins to Jannette Amini, Manager of Legislative Services/Clerk, County of Frontenac, advising that North Frontenac Council decided they were not going to get into the Seniors' Housing game and felt that a provider of such accommodations would be the right approach; and the Mayor advised he would provide a report requesting North Frontenac be allowed to use our portion of the funds as a contribution to a Seniors' Residence Home, built and run by a provider;

And That Council receives for information an email dated April 17, 2020 from Ms. Amini advising she had reviewed the North Frontenac Business Plan that was approved by North Frontenac Council last year and under Governance, it provides different scenarios including project ownership or just project oversight – in which it indicates that the North Frontenac Non-Profit Housing Corporation already owns and operates a number of buildings and leaves open the opportunity for discussion with them on any form of involvement in the ownership of the building; and that it also notes an alternate approach which is the creation of a separate, legally distinct non-profit housing corporation that has representation from both the NFHC and the Township on its Board of Directors which facilitates arm's length local oversight. It notes that this on-going involvement of the Township would further help to provide stability and continuity for the project which is seen as highly desirable in getting the project up and running where the Townships does not want to take on ownership responsibilities;

And That Council receives for information an email dated May 1, 2020 from Ms. Amini advising she had met with Kelly Pender, CAO, County of Frontenac, and Joe Gallivan, Director of Planning and Economic Development; regarding Mayor Higgins' questions regarding Seniors' Housing and if current funding from the County permits a Township to allocate its portion to an outside provider so that the Township does not assume ownership; and that based on that meeting, there are three options available to the Township:

Option 1: The Seniors' Housing development is owned and operated by the Township. Based on your below emails, this is not the preferred option that the Township of North Frontenac Council wishes to proceed with.

Option 2: The Seniors' Housing development is owned and operated by a Board of the Township. Section 196 of the Municipal Act provides a municipality with the power to establish municipal service boards as well as set out the criteria for Board members, i.e. composition, quorum and budgetary process of the board, how the Board members will be selected, their term of office, voting criteria etc. as well as the relationship between the municipality and the board, including their financial and reporting relationship. This

makes the operations separate from the municipality for liability purposes, but allows for some input, while protecting the municipal investment.

Option 3: The Township carries out a procurement process to have Seniors' Housing developed by either an existing not for profit entity, or a private developer, provided that there are agreements in place with the proponent to protect the County's investment;
And That Council approves Option #3 as amended; and Mayor Higgins, Councillor Hermer, the CAO, the Treasurer and the Clerk meet to discuss how to implement Option #3; and provide a recommendation to Council with respect to number of units, how to implement, etc.
